The Community Coalition for Social Justice (CCSJ) was founded in 1999. It is a coalition of organizations and individuals dedicated to promoting the principles of social and economic justice and respect for all persons and to opposing discrimination and hate-motivated violence in Morgantown and surrounding communities. We welcome all individuals and organizations who share our goals to become members of CCSJ.

CCSJ thanks Sharon Turner, Ellen Hathaway, and Nancy Gallagher of the Morgantown Public Library for their assistance and the Morgantown City Council and Dan Boroff, Morgantown city manager, for providing the funds to make this project possible. The Appalachian Community Fund provided \$4000 through a grant to CCSJ to purchase books for the Clay-Battelle and Clinton District Public Libraries in 2004-2005. The Appalachian Community Fund, based in Knoxville, Tennessee, provided funding for books for the Clay-Battelle and Clinton District libraries.

The books in this catalogue are available at the Morgantown Public Library (M) at 373 Spruce Street, Cheat Area Public Library (Cheat) at 121 Crosby Road, Clay-Battelle Public Library (CB) at 6059 Mason-Dixon Highway in Blacksville, Clinton District Public Library (CD) at 2005 Grafton Road, or Arnettsville Public Library (A) at 4120 Fairmont Road as noted by the appropriate initials. The Community Coalition for Social Justice (CCSJ) has provided the funding for almost all the books included here that are at the Morgantown Public Library, Clay-Battelle Public Library, and Clinton District Public Library. If the same title is available at the Cheat Area Public Library or Arnettsville, which was not open when we started this project, that is indicated here, although those materials were purchased with other funds.

Developing this catalogue was a cooperative effort. Suzanne Gosden Kitchen, then of the West Virginia University Job Accommodation Network, compiled the list of books about children and disabilities from which the library purchased many of the books in these categories in 2003. Most of these books are listed here under the type of disability, i.e., asthma/allergies, cancer, etc., rather than under the broad title of "Disabilities-General Topics" to make it easier to find sources on a topic. Faculty and staff of the West Virginia University Native American Studies Program identified resources to purchase on Native Americans in 2005. Members of the Morgantown Chapter of the National Organization for Women and West Virginia University Center for Women's Studies identified books on women's history in 2006.

Wherever possible, we have included reading levels for the children's books.

Teachers' guides are listed at the end of the brochure.

Books indicated with an** were donated in honor of Emily A. Spieler, CCSJ founder and first president (1999-2002).

Our first "catalog" was produced in July 2007, and we updated it in July 2020 to reflect current holdings.


